SPECIAL SHOW REGULATION AND BY-LAWS

- 1) **SHOW OPEN.** The Show will be open to the public on Saturday from **8.00am until late.**
- 2) **ADMISSION.** Members, on presentation of their Membership ticket, will be admitted free to the grounds. Non-members will be charged an admission fee of \$8.00 per person on Show day.
- 3) **CAR PARKING.** There will be a charge of \$2.00 per vehicle for parking on the grounds. Member's vehicles exempted.
- 4) **ENTRY FEES** in all classes must be remitted with the single entry form; otherwise the entry will not be received, except horse classes, which use the ticket system.
- 5) **EXHIBITS** entered in wrong classes by the Exhibitor may be transferred to the proper classes by the Stewards.
- 6) **EXHIBITORS**, if called upon by the Committee, shall prove the correctness of their certificates of entry by statutory declaration or otherwise.
- 7) **THE SOCIETY** will not be responsible for any accident caused to, through or by any exhibitor or person, and will not under any circumstance hold itself responsible for any loss or mis-delivery of livestock or exhibit of any kind or for any damage done thereto.
- 8) **ALL EXHIBITS** must be delivered to and from the grounds at the risk of the exhibitor.
- 9) **ALL EXHIBITS** must be on the grounds at the time stated in the schedule or if not stated, then not later than 9.00am on the judging day.
- 10) **NO ENTRIES** will be received except on the condition that all disputes, objections and protests shall be decided by the Committee of the Show Society (or majority of those present) whose decision shall be final.
- 11) **NO PERSON** other than a Steward or Official Attendant on Livestock exhibits, will be allowed in that section of the grounds or building in which the exhibits are placed during judging. Any person so offending shall forfeit the right to a prize and it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the judges and if necessary, order the removal of such offenders from the grounds.

- 12) **EXHIBITORS** and persons admitted to the grounds shall be subject to the regulations of the Stewards, and person or persons causing nuisance by loud comments on the 'Judges' decisions or other unseemly or insulting behaviour and not ceasing such nuisance after being cautioned and in the case of exhibitors, will be liable to disqualification.
- 13) **ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITS** must remain on the Showground until 4.00p.m on Saturday. Pavilion exhibits remain until Sunday. NO exhibit will be allowed to be removed without the sanction of the Secretary or Stewards. In case of a breach of this rule, all prizes that have been awarded to an exhibitor may be forfeited unless a satisfactory reason is given.
- 14) **PRIZEMONEY** unclaimed and outstanding for six months will be forfeited to the Society.
- 15) **DISPUTES.** In case any dispute may arise as to the construction to be put upon any of the By-laws and Regulations, the same shall be determined by the Committee of the Society, whose decision shall be final.
- 16) STEWARDS**
- 17) STEWARDS will obtain Award books from the Secretary and direct the judges to the exhibits they are appointed to judge, and shall carefully explain conditions of each class.
- 18) STEWARDS shall attend on the Judges to afford any information required, but shall not do nor say anything to influence their decision. They must not reveal the names of the exhibitor or repeat the remarks that the Judge may make.
- 19) STEWARDS will obtain the prize cards or ribbons, from the Secretary and affix same to the exhibit after filling in the name of the successful exhibitors and other particulars.

JUDGING: In the event of there being no competition in a class, the merit of the exhibit shall be the sole guide in awarding or with-holding of any prize, also if the merit of the exhibits in any class is not, in the opinion of the judges, sufficient to entitle them to a prize, the judge may withhold any or all prizes in the class. All intending exhibitors are respectfully requested to carefully read the regulations of each section.

ENTRIES: In accordance with Regulation 4 of the General Regulations of the Society's Constitution, entries must be made in writing on the prescribed form accompanied by the entry fee, and must reach the Secretary before judging.

PROTESTS: Any competitor or exhibitor, who wishes to lodge a dispute or protest, shall do so in writing to the Secretary, together with the fee of \$50.00 within 15 minutes of the completing of the Event. A decision will be made in line with Rule 15 of the Society's Regulations and By-laws. The \$50.00 fee will be refunded in the protest is upheld.

DRUG & ALCOHOL POLICY

The Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc. considers that any Judge, Steward or Person who is affected by alcohol or drugs while performing a duty at an Agricultural Show or Show Committee organised function, is considered an unacceptable form of behaviour which will not be tolerated under any circumstances.

- 1) The Chamber considers that all persons assisting at a Show or function should be free of any intimidation or embarrassment caused by any person who is affected by alcohol or drugs.
- 2) The Executive or the Show Society or person in charge of the Event must ensure that any Judge, Steward or Person is not subject to any behaviour which is a personal embarrassment to the Members of the Show Society or renders the Show Society in disrepute.
- 3) Any reports of alcohol or drug abuse will be treated seriously and action will be taken immediately to remedy the problem.
- 4) Disciplinary action may be taken against any person who is in breach of these protocols.
- 5) Any Judge, Steward or Person affected by alcohol or drugs by their actions may be liable under the Workplace, Health and Safety Act.
- 6) Disciplinary action arising from any incident involving alcohol or drug abuse may involve a warning, dismissal or referral to authorities.

Responsibility of Society

All competitors, voluntary workers and persons attending the show must acknowledge that it is a condition of Acceptance of this nomination that neither the Show committee nor the council of the Shire of Banana will be responsible in any respect of injury, loss or damage personally or otherwise which may be suffered by him/her in consequence of or any way arising out of his attendance at or participation in the show and he must agree for himself, his executors and administrators to indemnify this Committee and the council and members thereof in respect of any such claim.

Loss by Disease: The entry form will be taken as a guarantee that the animals specified therein are free from all disease so far as known by the owner. In the case of infectious disease being spread through, or by any exhibitor, the exhibitor will be responsible.

Fire: Precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property and exhibitions, but exhibits will not be at the cost of the Association.

Damage to Exhibits: The Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss or damage to or miss delivery of exhibits

Section 3

Prime Cattle

Conditions

1. All cattle are to be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for a period of three (3) months prior to the Show.
2. **All cattle MUST be N.L.I.S. compliant, be accompanied by a completed N.V.D. & an Animal Health Declaration with Entry form and Entry fees before judging.**
3. All classes are to be judged on quality, weight for age, confirmation, condition, depth and evenness.
4. The Stewards have the right to reject any pen in any one class or change a pen from one class to another.
5. **Exhibitors are not allowed in the yards whilst cattle are being judged.**
6. Cattle must be dehorned.
7. The Stewards shall have the right to reject cattle not conforming to the general standard of Show Cattle condition.
8. No beast can compete in more than one class.
9. All cattle must be painted.
10. **Colored Ear Tags AVAILABLE from Stewards with 24 hours notice** to distinguish classes of cattle.
Vealer – Purple; Yearling – Green, Milk Teeth – Orange, Two Teeth – White, Four Teeth – Blue, Six Teeth – Yellow, Eight Teeth – Red.
11. All cattle are subject to being mouthed; therefore, exhibitors must enter cattle in the right class.
12. All cattle competing may be crop or pasture fed.
13. Cattle shall be yarded by 11.00am Friday 10th May.
14. If insufficient entries are received, classes will be combined to ensure competition.
15. This will be at the Stewards discretion.
16. Cattle shall be fed hay and watered.
